


HEALTHSCAPE is an information system supporting and providing accountability for public health action in the natural, built and social environments. It was developed 'in-house' by Community and Public Health (a division of CDHB).

HOW IT WORKS

- Like a patient management system, only focused on settings, such as schools, community groups or license premises
- Shows history of interventions and the work done


BEFORE HEALTHSCAPE

- Death by spreadsheet!
- Many overlapping, mutually inconsistent poorly maintained information sets
- Staff unaware of who else had visited a setting
- No up-to-date and consistent data about external entities, eg address lists, locations and contact people



WITH HEALTHSCAPE


 Varied information management and reporting needs now managed through a freely available, consistent, user-driven interface and a consolidated information system
